Description:

The Port and Vessel Security for Public Safety & Maritime Personnel course is an eight-hour training program designed to educate rural public safety officials and personnel in maritime jurisdictions who may respond to incidents in those jurisdictions.

Through this course, first responders will gain a better understanding of the criticalities of the maritime system there by increasing their ability to defend it. The training will also enable first responders to better assist the facilities and vessels with the orderly, secure, and safe flow of commerce that is vital to all maritime communities and to the nation.

The following key elements serve as the basis for the course:

- Characteristics of the U.S. Maritime Transportation System
- Threats to the Maritime Transportation System, including ferries and passenger vessels
- Maritime security related issues arising from natural disasters
- Maritime security levels
- Threats to critical maritime infrastructure and threats posed by small vessel-borne improvised explosive devices (VBIEDs)
- The Transportation Worker Identification Credential (TWIC card)
- Maritime environment safety issues
- Homeport and the Area Maritime Security Committee Resources
