2016 NEW YORK WILDFIRE AND INCIDENT MANAGEMENT ACADEMY

Introduction and Background: The primary goal of the NIMS ICS All-Hazards Position Specific Training Courses is to provide all-hazards competencies and behaviors for Command and General Staff and selected Unit Leader personnel who are members of an existing or developing Incident Management Team (IMT). Competencies in the training are focused around the ability of the student to assume specific position responsibilities, lead assigned personnel, communicate effectively, and to ensure the completion of assigned tasks in order to meet identified objectives for the position. Personal qualifications to serve as members of IMT's are designed to consider a combination of training, operational experience during exercises or actual incidents, job shadowing, field mentoring, and administrative requirements.

Course Description: This Course covers all the NWCG requirements regarding aircraft types and capabilities, aviation management and safety for flying in and working with agency aircraft, tactical and logistical uses of aircraft, and requirements for helicopter take-off and landing areas. Additional time will be devoted to cover aspects of the All-Hazard Air Operations course that differ from NWCG course requirements.

Target Audience and Student Selection Criteria: Persons currently or likely to assume a role working with aircraft operations on an Incident Management Team To ensure the most appropriate target audience for this course, SOEM will review all registrations prior to acceptance to the course.

Prerequisites:

- Satisfactory completion of NWCG pre-course work.
- ICS 100, ICS 200, ICS 300, IS 700 and IS 800
