NIMS EXECUTIVE WORKSHOP

This workshop is designed to familiarize participants with the National Incident Management System (NIMS); the Incident Command System (ICS); New York State Executive Law Article 2-B; the New York State Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP); and the National Response Framework (NRF).
