



INSTRUCTIONS for Applying for Sparkling Devices Certification

Section A

Line 1 – Enter the full name of the person or entity (business or organization name) that is applying for a certificate. Include any assumed name(s) under which the registrant does business.

Line 2 – Enter your Tax Identification Number.

Lines 3 through 7 – Check one box only. If you wish to apply for more than one type of certificate you must complete a separate application for each type of certificate.

Section B

Line 1 – Enter the full legal name of the person or entity (business or organization name) and any assumed name, DBA, or any other business name that will be conducting business on behalf of the applicant that is applying for a certificate.

Line 2 – Enter the address(s) where the registrant will conduct business. Specialty Retailers, Permanent Retailers and Temporary Seasonal Retailers must list each location that they will conduct business.

Important: Registrants must ensure that all locations listed are in a city or county that has not opted by local law, pursuant to section 405.00(5)(b) of the Penal Law to include sparkling devices in the definitions of “fireworks” and “dangerous fireworks”.

Line 3 – List the business telephone number for each person/entity listed in line 1.

Line 4 – List the principal officers of the entity.

Line 5 – List the contact person who may be reached 24 hours a day 7 days a week for purposes of emergency of the provisions of this part and the uniform code.

Section C

By completing and signing section C, the registrant is certifying that all information contained in this application is correct and accurate.

Section D

Obtain Notarization.
