The NYSDEC issued an Emergency Authorization August 26, 2011 for work in navigable waters, streams and wetlands, regulated under ECL Article 15 and Article 24, which expired for all counties on October 8, 2011 except Broome, Chenango and Tioga, where authorization extends to November 7, 2011. www.dec.ny.gov/permits/6061.html
