



Training Announcement: EVOC Instructor School

October 16-27, 2017

State Preparedness Training Center

Course Description

This course is designed to train agency training officers to become EVOC Instructors for in-service and academy classes. Master instructors will cover the basic elements of emergency vehicle operations through classroom discussion, demonstration, and student application of skills. Students will develop their own lesson plans and deliver presentations for critique. Students will also hone their skills on the EVOC track and be expected to complete skill exercise at an 80% to pass the course. All police and peace officers who meet the course prerequisites and standards will be awarded the DCJS EVOC Instructor certification. Fire and EMS will receive DHSES certificate of completion.

Students MUST provide their own vehicles- vehicles will NOT be provided by the SPTC.

Topics Include

V&T law related to emergency vehicle operations, vehicle dynamics, defensive driving, teaching methods and presentation skills, and hands-on coaching on the EVO Track.

Course Provider

This course is being taught by a team of instructors from the State Preparedness Training Center and the National Center for Security & Preparedness.

Audience / Prerequisites

The target audience for this course is law enforcement, fire, and EMS.

Police or peace officers (for DCSJ certification): Basic Course for Police Officers, an equivalent, the Campus Public Safety Officer Course or the emergency driver training unit of both basic course; and a valid MPTC General Topics Instructor certificate.

EMS or Fire: Must have completed equivalent emergency driver training and instructor development course.

Students must have a valid NYS Driver's license, bring an agency-assigned vehicle with a valid NYS inspection sticker, and provide proof of completed prerequisites.

The New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services reserves the right to determine eligibility for this course.

Recommended Equipment

- Laptop computer with MS Office Suite (Students are required to prepare lesson plans and presentations, and the SPTC has a limited number of workstations available.)
- USB drive or other removable media device
- Sunglasses, baseball hat, sunscreen, bug spray
- Water bottle or other hydration device
- Rain and/or cold weather gear (seasonal for Oriskany, NY)
- Vehicle maintenance supplied (oil, engine coolant, windshield fluid, etc.)

New SPTC Registration Process

In 2017, DHSES launched a new registration process for the State Preparedness Training Center (SPTC). Course registrations will be accepted through the web-based SNAP system. All student registrations will be reviewed by the SPTC. Once you are accepted into this course, you will receive a confirmation email from the Center.
