INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM - NATIONAL TRAINING CURRICULUM

Description:

Emergency Public Information Officers (PIOs) are responsible for ensuring that the affected public receives accurate and timely information during an emergency. As incidents expand in complexity, multiple agencies, departments, and jurisdictions integrate into incident management activities both at command and coordination levels. In multiagency response, several Public Information Officers (PIOs) may be assigned to the incident, requiring increased coordination. The National Incident Management System (NIMS), based on best practices, recommends that response officials establish:

- 1. The Joint Information System (JIS): The JIS provides the mechanism to organize, integrate, and coordinate information for timely, accurate, accessible, and consistent messaging across multiple jurisdictions and/or disciplines, including private sector and nongovernmental organizations (NGOs).
2. The Joint Information Center (JIC): The JIC is used to ensure coordination of public information during incidents that involve multiple agencies and/or jurisdictions. The Incident Command/Unified Command may use a JIC to support the gathering, verification, coordination, and dissemination of accurate, accessible, and timely information. The JIC is a central location that facilitates operation of the JIS.

Course Objectives:

- Describe the JIS approach to managing information.
• Assess current management practices and capabilities to organize and lead a local JIC.
• Identify organizational structures and resources to facilitate operations with State and Federal JIC partners.
• Given a scenario, organize and operate a JIC.
