



## **Training Announcement: Incident Tactical Dispatcher (INTD)**

**October 22nd - October 25th, 2019**

**State Preparedness Training Center**

### **Course Description**

This course provides a basic understanding of the roles and responsibilities of an Incident Tactical Dispatcher (INTD) working in a tactical environment. An incident Tactical Dispatcher is a specially trained individual qualified to operate in a command post, base camp or at the incident scene in support of a specific incident or tactical operation. Incident Tactical Dispatchers may support the Communications Unit as a single resource or as part of an incident tactical dispatch team. Dispatchers support planned events, and extended incidents such as hostage situations, multi-alarm fires, search and rescue operations, bombings, and active shooter incidents.

### **Topics Include**

The course provides a realistic, hands-on approach to mastering the tasks and skills of an Incident Tactical Dispatcher. Incident Tactical Dispatchers leverage the multi-tasking, communication, accountability and documentation skills of successful telecommunicators to provide public safety communications expertise. The final day of the training includes an INTD exercise.

### **Course Provider**

This course will be taught by a team of ECD/ICTAP Instructors from the Department of Homeland Security who have both practitioner and COMU Experience.

## Audience and Equipment Requirements

The target audience for this course are experienced dispatchers who are familiar with the Incident Command System, public safety background with three years of experience in dispatch operations, and awareness of fundamental public safety communications technology. Maximum of 20 students.

- IS-100, Introduction to the ICS
- IS-144, Telecommunicators Emergency Response Taskforce (TERT)
- IS-200, ICS for Single Resources and Initial Incidents
- IS-700, National Incident Management System (NIMS)
- IS-800, National Response Framework (NRF)
- Must have completed ICS-300, Intermediate Incident Command System in a classroom setting

## Registration Process

All student registrations will be reviewed by the SPTC with approvals sent to students NO LATER THAN 2 weeks prior to the start of the class. Registration does not guarantee a seat in the class. If you are accepted into this course, you will receive a confirmation email from the Center.
