



Training Announcement: Public Safety CBRNE Response - Sampling Techniques and Guidelines (PER-222)

November 7-9, 2017

State Preparedness Training Center

Course Description

The course provides diverse agency representatives who have hazardous material backgrounds the ability to coordinate with local and state emergency responder agencies; to assess CBRNE events; conduct area surveys in a safe and effective manner; conduct material characterization and screening operations; and, collect public safety samples in a hazardous environment.

This course provides participants with an opportunity to perform public safety sampling techniques required in the response to a CBRNE event. As observed by the course instructors, participants should take part in classroom activities. Participants, who all have hazardous material backgrounds, will be given the opportunity to demonstrate knowledge, skills, and abilities associated with performing public safety sampling operations required in a CBRNE environment.

Topics Include

Public safety response overview; CBRNE field screening; Public safety sampling and documentation; Practical skills and exercises; Scenarios.

Course Provider

This course was developed and will be taught by Instructors from the National Center for Biomedical Research and Training (NCBRT) at Louisiana State University, a member of the National Domestic Preparedness Consortium.

Target Audience

- Responders most likely to be called upon to operate within the exclusion zone of a CBRNE incident involving hazardous materials—responders able to utilize personal protective equipment (PPE) at Level C or higher, employ monitoring and detection devices and procedures, and (potentially) obtain samples from the scene for analysis.
- Responders who work with HazMat teams in roles that may not require exclusion zone entry. This second group includes law enforcement, public health, and other personnel with the responsibility to receive and transport a sample from the HazMat team to a designated laboratory.
- Supervisory and management personnel responsible for developing policies and procedures governing emergency responder actions during CBRNE terrorist incidents. This course presents information on how participants can effectively interact with other local, state, and federal partners to respond efficiently to such an emergency.

Prerequisites

This course is intended primarily for HazMat technicians. This course is also intended for law enforcement personnel tasked with supporting the operational phase of a CBRNE incident and transitioning into the crime scene investigation phase; laboratory; public health; and environmental personnel.

- Successful completion of a WMD awareness-level training course
- Current HazMat technician-level certification
- Respiratory medical clearance for wearing Level C PPE (29 Code of Federal Regulations [CFR] 1910.134)
- Trained in PPE and medically cleared by their agency to operate in PPE

The New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services (DHSES) reserves the right to determine eligibility for this course.

SPTC Registration Process

In 2017, DHSES launched a new registration process for the State Preparedness Training Center (SPTC). Course registrations will be accepted through the web-based SNAP system. All student registrations will be reviewed by the SPTC. Once you are accepted into this course, you will receive a confirmation email from the Center.
