Course Description

PER-340-1 Active Threat Integrated Response Train-the-Trainer

Description

The Active Threat Integrated Response Course Train-the-Trainer (TTT) is level, direct delivery course designed to prepare trainer participants to effectively conduct an indirect delivery of the Active Threat Integrated Response Course. It contains a review of module content, practical exercises, guidance on becoming a trainer, and administrative Information and tasks The course provides law enforcement officers with key medical skills based on tactical emergency casualty care (TECC) guidelines which can be used at the point of injury (POI) to increase survivability of victims. The course also provides a model framework for law enforcement, fire, and EMS to integrate responses during an active shooter event through the rescue task force concept using the Active Shooter Incident Management Checklist. Participants should be state-certified law enforcement, fire, EMS, or first medical response providers. EMS providers should be EMT-B certified (preferably EMT-I or EMT-P).

- Describe the Active Threat Integrated Response Course Train-the-Trainer course goal, terminal learning objectives, and course schedule.
- Provide an overview of the module content in the Active Threat Integrated Response Course.
- Successfully teach the practical exercises in the Active Threat Integrated Response Course.
- Describe steps to become an NCBRT trainer and teach an indirect delivery
