AWR-343 Hurricane Awareness

Description:

This course provides emergency managers, first responders, and community members from all sectors with a basic understanding of the latest knowledge in hurricane science, forecasting, warning, and preparedness. This course enhances the ability of state/local decision-makers to identify and describe the hazards associated with hurricanes and to better prepare for and mitigate the impacts of high winds, heavy rain, and storm surge.

Course Objectives:

- Summarize the structure and characteristics of tropical cyclones and associated hazards.
- Explain the hurricane forecasting process and the National Weather Service's hurricane advisory system.
- Demonstrate comprehension of the National Weather Service's hurricane advisory products.
