Training Announcement: Introduction to Air Operations Course (IAO) (L-987)

September 26-27, 2022 (2 days)

Introduction and Background

The primary goal of the NIMS ICS All-Hazards Position Specific Training Courses is to provide all-hazards competencies and behaviors for Command and General Staff and selected Unit Leader personnel who are members of an existing or developing Incident Management Team (IMT). Competencies in the training are focused around the ability of the student to assume specific position responsibilities, lead assigned personnel, communicate effectively, and to ensure the completion of assigned tasks in order to meet identified objectives for the position. Personal qualifications to serve as members of IMTs are designed to consider a combination of training, operational experience during exercises or actual incidents, job shadowing, field mentoring, and administrative requirements.

Course Description

This course is intended to familiarize students with the basic concepts of air operations as associated with deployment through Incident Management Teams (IMTs).

Target Audience and Student Selection Criteria

NIMS ICS Position Specific training should be completed by personnel who are regularly assigned to functional, support, or unit leader positions on USFA or other Type III All-Hazards Incident Management Teams (AHIMT), or by those persons who desire to seek credentials/certification in those positions.

Students should hold current FAA Part 61 and/or Part 107 certificates and be familiar with the potential interface between manned and unmanned aircraft operations during an incident.

Registration Process

All student registrations will be reviewed by OEM and the SPTC with approvals sent to students NO LATER THAN 2 weeks prior to the start of the class. If you are accepted into this course, you will receive an enrollment confirmation email from the DHSES LMS.

To register for this course, log onto <https://lmsportal-dhSES.ny.gov/AcadisViewer/Login.aspx> with your LMS account login. Click on the “Browse” link. Select “filters” and search for “Air” in the keyword box. Select the “Register” button on the right side of the page.

Important Note: In addition to the above LMS procedure, before attending this class you must have a FEMA Student Identification Number (SID). If you do not already have an SID you can register for one at <https://cdp.dhs.gov/FEMASID>

Completion

Participants, who actively participate in the course, attend all course hours and pass a written final exam will receive FEMA Emergency Management Institute (EMI) Certificate of Completion.

Lodging

Lodging will be provided on the nights of September 25, 26, 2022 for public sector personnel whose residence and official work station are more than 50 miles from the SPTC.

Lodging is not available for federal employees or private industry participants. You must be enrolled in the course and have received lodging confirmation from the SPTC before arriving at the Center, or your lodging will not be covered, and you will not be allowed in the class.
