

In January of 2000, roommates Sean Ryan and Joseph LePore started a fire in a dormitory lounge. Were they on a murderous rampage? Prosecutors have said the two freshman were up late celebrating a victory by the basketball team. Three students died, and 58 others were injured because of their prank. They faced 30 years in prison on felony murder charges. After pleading guilty to 3rd degree arson, they were sentenced to 5 years.

On Campuses throughout the country, many college students foolishly get the idea that setting fires is a funny activity. Bulletin boards, banners, microwaves, couches and other furniture; setting items like these ablaze is all too common. Rarely is this done with intent to cause injury or death. It's ignorantly viewed as just a gag, often coinciding with high spirits, partying, and alcohol consumption.
