Charles Bush joined the Interoperable Communications Technical Assistance Program (ICTAP) team in January 2014, working primarily with the development of regional and statewide Tactical Interoperable Communication Plans (TICPs) and Interoperable Communications Field Operations Guides (FOGs). For the last two years he has also worked with the CASM development and support team.

Charlie began his public service career with the Michigan State Police in 1974 as a non-sworn member of the department with duties that included administrative support and dispatch. As a sworn member of the department he rose from the ranks of trooper to major, serving in the department's Uniform Services, Investigative Services, Administrative Services, and Science, Technology and Training Bureaus as well as the Office of Emergency and Specialized Services. At the time of his retirement in 2011 Major Bush was a member of the department's Executive Council.

Charlie spent a significant portion of his career with a focus on information sharing and information security. He was a member of the DEA's Coordinating Committee for the National Virtual Pointer System, and he was on the outreach team in support of the FBI's National Data Exchange (N-DEX). In 2008, he was appointed to the FBI's Criminal Justice Information Systems Advisory Policy Board (CJIS APB). He served as the Vice-Chair of both the APB's Security and Access Committee and the Security Policy Working Group.

Charlie is a graduate of the FBI National Academy at Quantico, Virginia and the Law Enforcement Executive Leadership Institute at Central Michigan University. He is past president of the National Alliance of State Drug Enforcement Agencies and the Michigan Chapter of the FBI National Academy Associates.
