

Michael J. Beckman – Brief Bio

Michael Beckman has over 30 years of government service, working in the areas of intelligence, national security and public security. He joined the Department of Homeland Security's Office of Intelligence & Analysis (I&A) as an Intelligence Officer (IO) in May 2011 and is assigned to the New York State Intelligence Center (NYSIC). As the IO for New York, Mike is responsible for executing the collection, analysis and reporting of information and intelligence related to counter terrorism, border security and cyber security. In this capacity, he serves as the primary intelligence liaison between the federal Intelligence Community and state officials. Prior to joining I&A, Mike had worked since 2003 as the Senior Analyst at the NYSIC-Counter Terrorism Center, where he was responsible for developing the state's intelligence analysis capabilities.

Previously, Mike served in the Navy in an intelligence capacity, with tours in Turkey and at the National Security Agency. He subsequently worked for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) in the D.C. area, working on international and interagency cooperative programs, and regulatory affairs. His duties at NOAA included the development of policy recommendations on export licensing of defense goods and services, and the development of remote sensing data and intelligence sharing arrangements with foreign governments.
