



Course Description

AWR-356 Community Planning for Disaster Recovery

Description:

Disaster Recovery is a complex, costly, and potentially lengthy process. Depending on the scope of a disaster, recovery efforts can last years and cost millions of dollars. Planning has a direct positive impact on a community's ability to recover from disasters. Planning for disaster recovery before disasters occur can significantly speed up and facilitate the post-disaster recovery process.

Community Planning for Disaster Recovery is an eight-hour awareness-level course that provides facilitated discussions on key concepts for disaster recovery planning, including the benefits of pre-disaster planning, key elements, and the plan development process. This course will prepare participants to initiate disaster recovery plans and participate in the long-term recovery planning process in their own communities through the review.

Course Objectives:

- Describe the key concepts of disaster recover planning
- Identify the roles and capabilities of various partner organizations involved in disaster recovery
- Evaluate and critique a sample disaster recovery plan
- Identify the steps involved in developing a disaster recovery plan
