



Course Description

National Emergency Management Basic Academy (NEMBA)

Description:

The goal of the Basic Academy is to support the early careers of emergency managers through a training experience combining knowledge of all fundamental systems, concepts, and practices of cutting-edge emergency management. The Academy provides shared classrooms of adult learners and skillful instructors resulting in a solid foundation upon which to build further studies and sound decisions.

Course Objectives:

The Basic Academy consists of the following classroom courses. The attendance at each course is required to graduate.

- E/L0101 - Foundations of Emergency Management (40 hrs)*
- E/L0102 - Fundamentals of Threats and Hazards (24 hrs)
- E/L0103 - Planning: Emergency Operations (16 hrs)
- E/L/K0146 - Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) (16 hrs) **
- E/L0105 - Public Information Basics (24 hrs)

*It is suggested, but not required, to first take the E/L0101 - Foundations of Emergency Management.

**Only an EMI class certificate dated after March 2013 will be accepted for the HSEEP requirement toward graduation.
